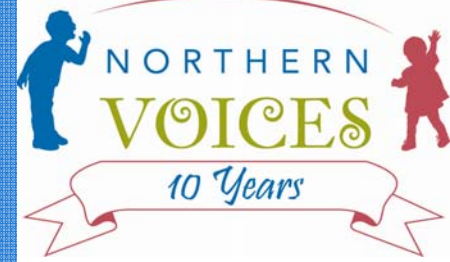

Northern Voices' Vision:

By the year 2013, Northern Voices will be known as an option for every family as a nationally-recognized, self-sustaining Center of Excellence redefining outcomes for children with hearing loss and their families.

As a school that focuses so much on language, you should know that we choose our words carefully. Some of you may wonder, what do we mean by "Center of Excellence"? To us, this means that we are continuously striving to become better. There are many ways in which we are working to be a Center of Excellence and I wanted to take this opportunity to share some of them with you. First, as a staff, we believe that learning about hearing loss and intervention is an ongoing process. Through continuing education such as journal reading groups and inservices we are working to constantly improve ourselves to provide state-of-the-art intervention services for our families and children. This includes the addition of the position of Lead Teacher. In January, Amanda Tocko will be taking on this very important role. Amanda has been working with Northern Voices since 2003. This summer, she took a very competitive examination for certification as a Listening and Spoken Language Specialist. Amanda will be spending time with me and with the teaching staff as a mentor and collaborator, helping us to focus on our strengths and weaknesses as an educational team.

Another way that we are working to become a Center of Excellence is by developing ways to monitor children's progress. We have seen throughout the years that kids with hearing loss, when they receive the best intervention services, can develop speech and

language skills equal to (or greater than) their age-matched, hearing peers. We wanted to look further into this, and make sure that, while children are doing well on these assessments, are there any gaps that continue to exist? Erika Hoyt and I are working on an item analysis of these assessments to determine if there are gaps, and, if there are, what can we do to eliminate them.

As we enter a new year at Northern Voices, the one marking our Ten Year Anniversary, we celebrate what we have become. But more than that, we celebrate what we **can** become. We believe that a Center of Excellence continuously strives to improve and to serve to the best of its ability. In 2009 we will continue to work to redefine expectations of children with hearing loss because we believe the possibilities are endless.

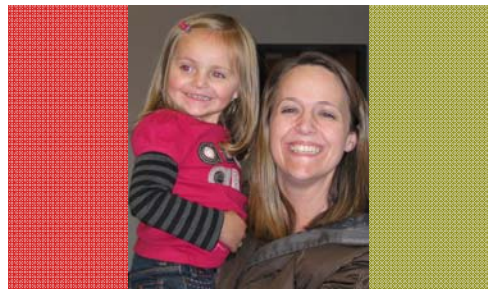
